Fundamentals of Chapter Disaster Operations Management

This is an interactive, instructor-led course designed to train Disaster Services leadership employees and volunteers to perform the fundamental roles and responsibilities of directing a disaster relief operation. ***5898H Required, **Prerequisite for Service Delivery Site Management**

Mass Care Overview

The purpose of this basic level Disaster Services training is to provide an overview of the activities performed by the Mass Care group in support of a disaster relief operation.

Logistics Overview

The purpose of this course is to provide basic information about the processes of Material Support Services activities in support of an American Red Cross disaster relief operation. Participants will learn about the skills, abilities and knowledge needed by Material Support Services workers and how they can become involved in their local chapter.

Shelter Operations/Shelter Simulation

The purpose of this course is to prepare employees and volunteers of the Red Cross and other agencies to manage shelter operations effectively and sensitively as a team while meeting the needs of people displaced as a result of a disaster. The simulation is to provide participants with an opportunity to apply the knowledge, skills and abilities required to operate a successful shelter.

Serving People with Disabilities

The purpose of this course is to review policies and practices of the Red Cross related to providing services to people with disabilities following a disaster.

Bulk Distribution

The purpose of this course is to prepare participants for the roles, responsibilities and tasks involved in setting up, operating and supporting a Bulk Distribution operation in the chapter and on a disaster relief operation.

National Shelter System

The purpose of this training is to prepare participants to manage shelter and agency information in the NSS.

Mass Casualty in Disasters

The purpose of this course is to prepare Red Cross employees and volunteers to provide a more effective initial response to a mass casualty disaster.

Collaborating to Ensure Effective Service Delivery *This is a 2 day course*

This course will prepare Red Cross employees and volunteers to establish collaborative relationships that contribute to a coordinated disaster response and help ensure effective service delivery. It will also prepare participants to begin conducting liaison activities in a chapter and establish a foundation for building a liaison career in the Disaster Services Human Resources (DSHR) System.

Psychological First Aid

This basic level Disaster Services course consists of five separate segments and a self-review questionnaire which is completed after the training has been completed. The course provides a framework for understanding the factors that affect stress responses in disaster relief workers and the clients they serve. In addition, it provides practical suggestions about what you can say and do as you practice the principles of Psychological First Aid.

Weapons of Mass Destruction

This course will provide basic information about the issues and safety concerns related to responding to a disaster incident involving Weapons of Mass Destruction/Terrorism. Participants will learn about the knowledge, skills, and abilities needed by disaster workers performing duties in this environment.

Disaster Fundraising: Preparing and Responding in Chapters

Learners understand how to organize and execute a disaster fundraising campaign for a disaster relief operation in this one-day, intermediate level course. Disaster Fundraising (DFR): Preparing and Responding in Chapters is a skills-based training course that provides the tools for chapter leadership, staff and volunteer fundraisers to prepare for and execute disaster fundraising campaigns in response to disasters within their jurisdiction, and during national disasters. The primary focus will be on the management of disaster fundraising at chapters for Level I – III relief operations.

Leadership Development Training

Participate with us as we “grow effectively” as leaders for a multi chapter or larger relief operation. Experience the opportunity to make decisions and then see consequences of those decisions in a non-threatening environment. This 2 day simulation allows you to receive first hand knowledge of some key elements of a disaster relief operation from preparedness capabilities through to after action analysis of the incident. ***5898H Required.**

Disaster Frontline Supervision & Simulation *This is a 2 day course*

This course will provide new supervisors with the knowledge and skills required to competently perform their roles and responsibilities according to elevated expectations and to use current tools and resources. ***5898H Required.**

Disaster Instructor Specialty Training *This is a 2 day course*

This instructor-led course is designed to prepare knowledgeable and experienced Disaster Services workers to be basic-level disaster training teachers, thereby ensuring uniform and quality disaster training that is consistent with Red Cross policies and the regulations and procedures of Disaster Services. ***5898H Required.**

Mass Care II *This is a 2 day course*

This course will prepare Red Cross paid and volunteer staff to establish, operate, and phase-out Mass Care services on a state and major disaster relief operation so clients' needs can be met in a timely, cost-effective manner. ***5898H Required.**

Client Casework: Providing Emergency Assistance

This basic disaster services course prepares Red Cross employees and volunteers to perform the tasks of an Individual Client Services Casework Service Associate.

Fundamentals of Disaster Public Affairs: The Local Response

The purpose of this course is to assist Red Cross employees and volunteers to work with the public affairs function on local disaster relief operations and initiating the function on state or major disaster relief operations.

Service Delivery Site Management: *This is a two day course*

The purpose of this course is to prepare Red Cross employees and volunteers to establish, operate, monitor and close a service delivery site in order to meet the needs of disaster clients in a timely and cost-effective manner.

ERV Training: Ready, Set, Roll

Orients participants with the equipment, general layout, and use of an ERV. Participants will learn techniques for driving and managing an ERV during a disaster response as well as the opportunity to take a driving test in an ERV. Defensive Driving is also required to be a qualified ERV driver.

Defensive Driving

This course will include theory as well as practical application to meet minimum qualifications set forth by National ARC to drive ERVs and agency vehicles.

Fundamentals of Disaster Public Affairs: The National Response

The purpose of this course is to assist Red Cross paid and volunteer staff to work with the public affairs function on local disaster relief operations and initiate the function on major national disaster operations. Fundamentals of Disaster Public Affairs I: The Local Response is a prerequisite for this course. ***\$898H Required**

EOC/Incident Command Liaison

This basic course prepares volunteers and employees who will be assigned to government and emergency settings to work collaboratively with Red Cross partners and help ensure a coordinated response that results in effective service delivery.

Financial and Statistical Information

The purpose of this basic-level disaster services course is to prepare Red Cross employees and volunteers to perform the tasks of a Financial & Statistical Information Management (FSI) Service Associate on a disaster relief operation.

Fundamentals of Disaster Assessment

The purpose of this basic level course is to introduce the critical role of disaster assessment, explore related preparedness tasks, learn how to collect and communicate disaster assessment information, and become familiar with how disaster assessment information supports management and service delivery decisions. No prerequisites.
